Lawrence "Larry" Wayne Hartman entered his new life on October 16, 2021. He was born to Max and Nell Rodgers Hartman on May 14, San Antonio, Texas. Larry graduated from Central Catholic High School and St. Mary's University (both San Antonio) with a B.S. Mathematics and entered the US Army as an Air Defense Artillery officer.

In 1972, he married Lynne at Ft Bliss, TX. During his 13 year Army career, he was stationed in S.Korea, Japan, Greece, and the US. After leaving active duty, he remained in the Army Reserves and was retired as a Lt. Colonel. He pursued a career as a Program Analyst in the Department of Defense Missile Defense Agency at Redstone Arsenal, AL. Altogether, he served 51 years with the US government.
