Even though Lois could not express her gratitude, she was very appreciative of them and looked forward to their visits.

In many ways Lois was a “mother” figure to the other residents. She would watch out for the other residents and tell us if someone needed something. She would straighten their collar, or brush crumbs off their face, or tell others to eat or do something that they needed to do.

Lois had a beautiful smile and she shared with us often. She also had a good sense of humor that she used to tease us many times. She thought of her days when she and her husband ran “camp” and she often thought I (Rita/Administrator) worked for her. She complained that we used too much electricity and wasted too much food. I had to give her a “monthly report” to let her know that operations were going smoothly. She also thought I (Rita) is a “Willis”. That made her love me (most of the time).

Lois wanted to be independent. She wanted to do things for herself and it frustrated her to accept help. She got a rollator/walker to help prevent falls. We thought she would reject it and not want to use it but she loved it. It was bright red and she was very proud of the “Cadillac”. That may have been what kept her “young”.

She loved to eat vegetables especially fresh corn and tomatoes. She enjoyed singing and listening to the piano. When she felt good she was quick with wit teasing others but didn’t like to be teased herself. Often she would comment to the staff that approached her, “look what the cat drug in”.

We will sorely miss Lois and her family. She brightened our days. She so wanted to return to Arab. We are both sad and happy that she received her wish. Welcome home to Arab, Lois.
